



### News from the MBP Core Group

#### Annual meeting and Senegal capacity-building

For the first time, we will hold our annual meeting in Africa. It will be part of a capacity-building workshop and development meeting for wetland educators in West Africa. On 6 to 10 October, Wetlands International, the Wadden Sea Flyway Initiative, and MBP will come together along with regional marine partners at NDangane, Senegal.

All MBP members are welcomed to participate! To help fund as much regional participation as possible, there will be a fee for those visiting from Europe, expected to be €140. This helps subsidise wider participation from wetland staff across West Africa, who will be supported with travel and accommodation costs.

The meeting will include two CEPA workshops, plus shorter presentations on specific techniques, and opportunities for direct exchange of experience. As the meeting coincides with World Migratory Bird Day, we hope to host a special activity, perhaps including hybrid online inputs.

#### Flyway Youth Forum 2022

The East Atlantic Flyway Youth Forum 2022 took place on 9 and 10 July. Held virtually, the Forum welcomed 30 people aged under 30, and trained them in fundraising for conservation. MBP joined the Common Wadden Sea Secretariat and Youth Engaged in Wetlands in running the Forum for a second consecutive year. The theme of fundraising emerged from the Forum in 2021, when both the Post-Forum Action Plan and participant feedback showed a need for the funds to match their energy and ambition.

The trainer, Maalike Mantan, is highly experienced, involved with BirdLife International and the Conservation Leadership Programme. She guided the participants through short but effective sessions that introduced how to plan a conservation project that can be funded, and how to get the forms right. We also heard from guest speakers from the Ramsar Secretariat, the Rufford Foundation, BirdLife International, and the Arctic Council.

#### Ramsar COP14

The big meeting of countries signed up to the Ramsar Convention on Wetlands will be held in Switzerland in early November. COP14 was originally due to be held last year in China, but COVID forced it to change time and location. It will now be remotely chaired by China, at a venue in Geneva. Will you be attending? #### Liminka Bay Visitor Centre

Aiming to make seashore meadows familiar to people

Liminka Bay Visitor Centre grounds have been renewed in a project that aims to increase people's knowledge of wetland habitats and the bird, plant, and insect species that inhabit hosts. A new nature trail was built along the seashore meadows to provide a better access for people to see these habitats. Finnish cartoonist and illustrator Seppo Leinonen took up to the task to provide signs full of nature information along the trail. The results were phenomenal!



In addition to the new nature trail, a garden was built next to the Visitor Centre to showcase the different habitat types in a seashore meadow. The access is to the shore meadows in Liminka Bay are restricted and difficult to reach but with the meadow garden, we can show the habitats and plant species right here next to the Visitor Centre!

#### Biodiversum

##### Vanishing Treasures Expo at Biodiversum

The Vanishing Treasures programme of the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), funded by the Government of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg, works towards the conservation of three iconic and endangered mountain species - the snow leopard in Central Asia (Tajikistan and Kyrgyzstan), the Royal Bengal tiger in Bhutan, and the mountain gorilla in the Greater Virunga landscape (Rwanda and Uganda). Vanishing Treasures aims to improve the understanding of the impacts of climate change on the species and their habitats, with the goal to increase the resilience of the species and the local mountain communities who live alongside them.



The expo was officially opened by Joëlle Wollff (Minister for the Environment, Climate and Sustainable Development of Luxembourg) and Bruno Pozzi (Director Europe Office, UNEP). Large, illuminated exhibition panels with texts and photographs are presenting the characteristics of the three Vanishing Treasures species, the threats to the species and their habitats, resulting conflicts with the local communities and how Vanishing Treasures is addressing these challenges. The exhibition visitors can experience the species and their habitats through augmented reality, virtual reality and sand art features, which are an integral part of the exhibition.
